- General track: (20 credits + one Bible credit per year in Christian School)
 - 4 credits Bible
 - 4 credits English
 - 3 credits Math Electives (Algebra I is required)
 - 3 credits Social Studies (World History, U. S. History, Government - ½, Economics - ½)
 - 3 credits Science (Biology, Physical Science, elective)
 - ½ credit Health
 - ½ credit PE
 - 1 credit Fine Arts Elective
 - 1 credit Computer Applications I
 - 4½ credits Electives
 - ACT composite test score of 15
 - Must obtain 6 hours of community service per semester starting in the ninth grade

- College Preparatory Track: (22 credits + one Bible credit per year in Christian School)
 - 4 credits Bible
 - 4 credits English
 - 4 credits Math Electives (Algebra I, Algebra II, Geometry, Pre-calculus)
 - 3 credits Social Studies (World History, U. S. History, Government - ½, Economics - ½)
 - 3 credits Science (Biology, Physical Science, Chemistry)
 - 1 credit Science or Social Studies (Advanced Biology II or AP History)
 - ½ credit Health
 - ½ credit PE
 - 2 credits Foreign Language (Spanish I and Spanish II)
 - 1 credit Fine Arts Elective
 - 1 credit Computer Applications I
 - 2½ credits Electives
 - ACT composite test score of 16
 - Must obtain 6 hours of community service per semester starting in the ninth grade

 - Students graduating must have a GPA of 3.0 or higher to receive the honors diploma
 - Students graduating with the college prep diploma with an honors option will be required to take at least five of the ten honors courses offered in grades 9 - 12.
